Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Hard to believe that we are into the second quarter of the year. April is always an important month in the calendar of Catholic schools. It is a time for Catholics to celebrate Easter, a feast that is as important as Christmas. What is the feast of Easter and why do we celebrate it?

It is a sacred time of the year, as we commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth. It follows a period of fasting called Lent which began on Ash Wednesday and will end on Good Friday, the day Jesus was crucified on the cross. Lent lasts for 40 days, during which Christians practise prayer, self-denial and acts of charity. This year, Easter Sunday falls on 4 April.

The feast is not about Easter bunnies or Easter eggs, although the symbolism remains the same. Easter traditionally falls during the onset of spring, which is a time when vitality returns to the land after the desolation of winter. It is when nature's cycle of life, death and rebirth is at its most visible. Eggs and bunnies are signs of new life, explaining why they appear as part of the traditions of celebrations during Easter.

The religious take on Easter is the time when God's only Son, Jesus, took on a death sentence, carried his cross and died on it. We, too, may find ourselves going through dark periods in our lives but we have faith that nothing amazing happens without sacrifice.

At the school, students are involved in Lenten projects such as the gift of love boxes that you may have seen them working on at home. Take time to talk to your children about the significance of these boxes and work with them on creating their unique boxes. 



Parenting Tips – Reading with your child

Read a book aloud to your child.





Have your child read a book to you.

Try choral reading (read aloud together).





Buddy read (take turns reading aloud).

Before

- What do you think this book will be about? Why do you think that?
- What does the title tell you about this book?
- What do you already know about the topic of this book?
- What questions do you have?
- Do you think this story is real or imaginary?
- Who is the author of this book? Have you read any other books by this author?

During

- What do you think will happen next?
- Why do you think . . . ?
- Where and when does this story take place?
- · How do you think the character will handle this situation?
- Why is the character . . . ?
- What does this word mean? How do you know?

After

- How would you retell this story, including parts from beginning, middle, and end?
- What questions would you ask the author?
- What do you think are the most important events in the story?
- · How did this character change throughout the story?
- · How would you have solved the problem?
- What evidence can you find?
