
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SCHOOL OF CHOICE FOR STUDENTS WITH HEARING LOSS

The school will now be able to better support the varied learning needs of our students as our teachers work closely with the staff from the Canossaville Children and Community Services. This unit is staffed by a team of psychologists, speech and occupational therapists, together with social workers. Parents will be informed if the school is of the view that their child may need support from these professionals for clearer speech production, for attention and focusing issues, for social cognition issues, just to name a few.

The school will also be mounting workshops aimed at equipping parents with competencies to develop healthy social and emotional skills in their children.

Our efforts at providing a holistic education can only be achieved if parents and teachers "talk the same talk" and "walk the same walk." We would therefore encourage all parents to attend these workshops.

Primary 4 and Primary 5 Camp Experience 2019

The P4 and P5 students, together with their inclusion programme schoolmates from CCPS, attended a 3 day 2-night camp at the MOE Dairy Farm Outdoor Adventure Learning Centre from Monday 14 January to Wednesday 16 January 2019.

The students participated in activities such as walking along the Wallace Education Centre Trail and trekking to SG Quarry. It was an experience which highlighted the ecology of the habitats in the lush tropical forest. Students learnt to be appreciative of nature and gained an understanding of why and how we should co-exist with nature.

The students also participated in a range of high and low element obstacles such as Abseiling, Rock Climbing, Zip Line "Flying Fox" and Challenge Pole Course. These activities helped develop their confidence, resilience and foster team spirit and a sense of togetherness. It also taught them how to problem solve when faced with difficulties.

On the third day, the students broke camp and headed back to school. They were tired but most were still bubbling with excitement for they had had an awesome time with their friends.
